The Celebrant continues





Instructions for Communion: All are welcome at the Lord's Table. Baptized Christians, regardless of denomination or age, are invited to receive Holy Communion. The ushers will indicate when it is time for your row to go up the center aisle to to receive. We will only offer the common chalice at the standing station by the pulpit, and you may choose to receive by drinking from the chalice or by intinction, dipping the bread in the chalice. When it is time to receive, the priest will place the bread in your hand. If you prefer to receive a blessing, simply cross your arms over your chest. If you choose not to receive from the chalice, please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest when it is offered. If accessing the altar platform is difficult for you, you may choose to receive at the standing station by the pulpit, or you may notify an usher, and a member of the clergy will bring communion to you in your seat. Gluten free wafers are available. Please ask the member of the clergy who is distributing communion to you.
